

President's Message

Common Sense Rules Outside Water Use Regulations for Summer 2015

During the period of May 15th thru September 15th or as otherwise specified by the LPHOA Board of Directors, the sprinkling of lawns and gardens, or **ANY** outside water usage, shall be limited in the following manner:

Washington, Park, 41st Street Monday, Wednesday, Friday

Ogden, Liberty Blvd., Williams Street Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday

Hours: 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. or 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

The above streets have outside water use privileges only on the days and hours stated.

Days alternate each year.

NO SUNDAY USE!

More than one hose, sprinkling systems, and LPHOA water individual storage tanks are prohibited. On a one-time basis WITH LPHOA APPROVAL, swimming pools using more than 1500 gallons of water may be filled after 10:00 p.m. but NOT IN JULY OR AUGUST.

Sprinkling cans filled at the spigot may be used anytime.

No other special permits will be issued.

Anyone violating these regulations shall be assessed a fine of \$25.00 for the first violation. Subsequent violations will be \$50.00 for each violation. These fines are subject to change depending upon water conditions prevailing. **NO WARNINGS WILL BE GIVEN!** Fines will be added to the LPHOA Maintenance Assessment.

LPHOA Spring Hydrant/Main Flushing

Mark your Calendars

Friday, April 24th beginning at 8:45 p.m. Rain Date – May 1st

The next day after the flushing, please follow the procedures below to ensure proper home plumbing maintenance.

- Drain hot water tank from bottom spigot with a hose if necessary until the water runs clear.
- Flush the inside plumbing by removing all inside faucet screens and turning on all inside faucets until the water runs clear.
- Regenerate water softener, etc.
- Change any water filter cartridge.

We recommend that you do not wash clothes after 8:00 p.m. on the night of the flush and not until you have completed the procedures above. If you experience any discolored water, please repeat the procedures again.

Place on parkway no earlier than 1 week before scheduled pick up and no later than 7:30 a.m. on the date pickup begins.

York Township

May thru October

Pickup will be the 1st full week of the month and must be on the parkway by 7:00 a.m.
