

#### President's Message

There will be a new survey sent out by the North Westmont Fire Protection District (NWFPD) in regards to the dissolution of the district. Please keep an eye out for it in the mail, you should receive it in the next 2-3 weeks if all goes well and it will come in a plain white envelope which could be mistaken as junk mail. With the dissolution of the district, the residents of Liberty Park have the opportunity to vote whether they want our property taxes to go up all-at-once, a two-step increase or a five year phase-in. The NWFPD must receive at least 75% of the completed surveys returned or our voice will not be heard and we will most likely get the all-at-once increase. #### Refuse Update

Upon execution of the contract for refuse and recycling hauling with Groot Industries, all single family residences, both attached and unattached, will have the option to choose among the following service options:

- 1. Unlimited: The unlimited option includes unlimited waste, recycling, lawn clippings, 1 bulk item and white goods.
- 2. Limited: The limited option includes limited waste, 1 bulk item and unlimited recycling.
- 3. Sticker: The sticker option includes the purchase of stickers to dispose of waste at the residents choosing.
- 4. 2 Cubic Yard Roll Off: A roll of 2 cubic yard container for waste pick up.

Groot Industries will be creating a public awareness campaign, including an informational brochure, outlining the benefits of the waste and recycling hauling program including, but not limited to cost, service requirements and collection schedules. The informational brochure will also include information about how to sign up for Groot's Robo Call program that will provide residents updates of when service will be affected by holidays and weather.

The Township and Groot Industries are working on the particulars of the contract at this time. When the contract negotiations are complete it will be before the Township Board for approval. Updates will be posted to the Township website at www.dgtownship.com.

#### **Daylight Savings**

Remember to turn your clocks ahead one hour before you go to bed on Saturday, March 12<sup>th</sup>.

#### Water Softener

It's important to disinfect your water softener every year. Follow the steps below to disinfect and always remember to check your manual first.

- 1. Lift the salt cover and use a bucket to fill the salt storage tank with about 3 gallons of water. The water line should be about 3 inches high.
- 2. Remove the brine well cover. Add 1 or 2 tablespoons of unscented household bleach into the brine well and replace the cover.
- 3. Open the bypass valve. Press the "On/Off/Hold" button for a full three seconds to start a recharge. The recharge will draw the bleach through the equipment and sanitize it. It should take about two hours to cycle depending on the salt type setting.

This first sanitizing recharge will also fill the salt tank to the water level needed and get all the air out of the resin tank. It gets the resin bed prepared and flushes residual chlorine out of the water softener too. It doesn't matter if you have salt or no salt in the storage tank when you are doing the sanitizing recharge.
