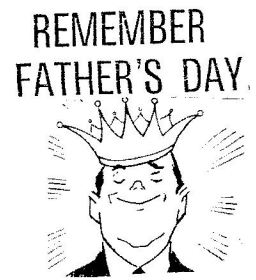

## LPHOA Water Dept. Message

Federal standards for drinking water were first issued in 1914 to prevent the interstate spread of communicable diseases and were modified and expanded several times thereafter. In 1962, the U.S. Public Health Services revised its drinking water standards. The standards set mandatory limits for health-related chemical and biological impurities. Most states and large cities used them as guidelines to regulate drinking water quality within their jurisdictions.

When the Environmental Protection Agency was established in December 1970, it assumed responsibility for setting and enforcing Federal drinking water regulations and continued work on a revision, already in progress, of the 1962 U.S. Public Health Service standards. This work served as the basis for the interim primary regulations developed under the Safe Drinking Water Act Congress enacted and the President signed on December 16, 1974. It authorized the States to enforce these standards and otherwise supervise public water supply systems.

The LPHOA Public Water System is under the jurisdiction of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the DuPage County Health Department. Well, booster and chemical pumps have been serviced as needed. Liberty Park drinking water is pumped from underground rock formations called aquifers. Water is stored in these shallow aquifers composed of sand and gravel under glacial drift soil and in limestone bedrock. This is the deep Cambrian-Ordovician Aquifer. LPHOA water is chlorinated, fluoridated and iron sequestered. Fluoridation was mandated, when Senate Bill 516 was passed on July 18, 1967. LPHOA started fluoridating our water in August 1970. LPHOA participates in the IEPA Analytical Service Program and Sample Supply Lab Testing Program. The LPHOA is a member of the Illinois Rural Water Association and the American Water Works Association.

### **Maintenance Assessments**

Residents can pay for the full year or pay in advance, additional payments will be applied to your account and reflected in future billings sent. Payments can now be paid by our new credit card payment system. There is a fee for this that goes directly to the credit card company, LPHOA does not receive any additional funds just what is owed to them. The fee amount varies depending upon balance owed so for example on a \$75.00 balance the fee is \$2.55. ### **2017 Outside Water Use Regulations**

During the period between May 15 – September 15, or as otherwise specified by the LPHOA Board of Directors, the sprinkling of lawns and gardens, or ANY outside water usage, shall be limited in the following manner:

**Washington, Park and 41<sup>st</sup> Streets – Monday, Wednesday, Friday**

**Ogden, Liberty Blvd. and Williams Street – Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday**

The above streets have outside water use privileges only on the days and hours stated. Days will alternate each year and there is **NO SUNDAY USE**. More than one hose, sprinkling systems and LPHOA water individual storage tanks **ARE PROHIBITED**. Sprinkling cans filled at the spigot may be use anytime. No other special permits will be issued. Anyone violating these regulations shall be assessed a fine of \$25.00 for the first violation, subsequent violations will be \$50.00 for each violation. These fines are subject to change depending upon water conditions prevailing. **NO WARNINGS WILL BE GIVEN**. Fines will be added to the LPHOA Maintenance Assessment.
