

Fix a Leak Week

Are you ready to chase down leaks? Household leaks can waste more than 1 trillion gallons of water annually nationwide, so each year we hunt down the drips during Fix a Leak Week. Mark your calendars for EPA's tenth annual Fix a Leak Week, March 19 through 25, 2018—but remember that you can find and fix leaks inside and outside your home to save valuable water and money all year long. The average household leaks more than 10,000 gal of water every year, or the amount needed to wash 270 loads of laundry. Common household leaks—worn toilet flappers, dripping faucets and leaking showerheads—can waste about 10% of a family's water bills. EPA encourages consumers to follow these clues to save water:

*Check pipe connections tightly to avoid water loss, or twist on a WaterSense-labeled faucet aerator to save water and energy.

*Replace old, leaky fixtures with WaterSense labeled models, which are independently certified to use less water and perform as well as or better than standard models.

Gas Warning

Gas connectors are corrugated metal tubes use to connect gas appliances in your home to fuel gas supply pipes. Certain older gas connectors may be dangerous. Uncoated gas connectors should be replaced immediately with with stainless or plastic-coated connectors.

Identity Theft

Identity thefts is a serious crime. It occurs when your personal information is stolen and used without your knowledge to commit fraud or other crimes. Deter thieves by shredding financial documents and protect your social security number by only giving it out when absolutely necessary.

IRS Scam

If you receive a call from someone claiming to be an IRS agent & they tell you that you must make a payment if you want to avoid the warrant being passed on to local authorities, contact the sheriff. The fake agent may provide you with a fake IRS badge number or know the last four digits of your social security number.

Mailboxes

Just a reminder, that it is a Federal offense to damage or tamper with another's mailbox. Anyone observing a crime should contact the post office immediately. When repairing a mailbox, they should be 42-48 inches high and 6-12 inches back of the gravel shoulder. Name and address number should be on the side of the mailbox or on the mailbox cover.
