- * Request to have **packages** delivered elsewhere.

LPHOA Board Elections

Do you know what qualifications are required to become a LPHOA Board Member? Qualifications include.....

- *Resident connected to the PHOA pubic water system for at least one (1) year.
 - * LPHOA member is in good standing
- * Shall have attended a minimum of four (4) meetings during the fiscal year
 - * Only one member of an immediate family living in the same household shall hold elective office.

The positions open for election this year include President, Secretary and a Trustee. The LPHOA Board has appointed Nadia Novak as the Nominating Chairman to make recommendations of qualified members for the election in November.
